Appendix A: Philippians 2:1-18

The following is Philippians 2:1-18 divided up as it is for your child through this resource.

- 1 So if there is any encouragement in Christ, any comfort from love, any participation in the Spirit, any affection and sympathy,
- 2 complete my joy by being of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind.
- 3 Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility significant than yourselves.
- 4 Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to those of others. Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus
- 6 who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born
- 8 And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.
- 9 Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name,
- 10 so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth,
- 11 and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of the Father our Lord forever and ever.

- Glory: Very great praise, honor
- Grasp: To seize upon and hold firmly
